



Council's insurers had resulted in the remaining two swings being condemned as being unsafe. Following a lengthy debate it was agreed that the condemned equipment should be demolished as soon as possible and that replacement equipment should be planned and installed as soon as the necessary funding could be raised from council and outside sources. The Chairman undertook to pursue the release of certain community funds held by the Community Association and Cllr Mrs Runnette agreed to approach "Community Solutions" to procure their assistance in planning a new children's play area.

#### 34/05-6 CLERKS REPORT

- a) Finance- a list of payments (prior circulated) was approved. Proposed Cllr Carr, Seconded Cllr Mrs Runnette & Passed. The payments were £29.38 IW Beacon, £139 Jamie Cramp, £40 SLCC, £288.23 I.Smith, Clerks salary £61.88 expenses.
- b) Administration: Hospice Carol Service- The Clerk read out a letter from the EMH requesting early details of any "Light up a life" services that might be carried out by the council, it was decided to investigate the availability of local venues for two days within period 21<sup>st</sup> 22<sup>nd</sup> or 23<sup>rd</sup> December. The Chairman undertook to investigate and liaise with the Hospice with regard to their advertisement in the Beacon.

The Clerk advised members regarding a petition for the launch of an all party Sustainable Communities Parliamentary Bill, the petition was then placed within the correspondence file for circulation to all members.

A letter from the Shalfleet Pre-School was read out , the letter outlined recent progress with new accommodation and included an invitation to all members to visit at anytime within school hours.

Invitations to attend two forthcoming meetings were passed and it was agreed Cllr Carr should attend the next meeting of the Parish & Town Council Planning Forum.

The Clerk briefed members on progress regarding a bid to obtain "Quality Status" and advised that he and the Chairman would be interviewed in late October.

The Clerk advised members he had received a report from a member of the public regarding the new enclosure of land in Mill Lane adjacent to the NT Car Park. Two members agreed to investigate and report back.

### 37/05-6 COUNCILLORS REPORTS

Cllr Mrs Runnette reported that finger posts at Dark Lane and Station Road still required attention.

Cllr.Carr. reported traffic lights in operation at the junction of Yarmouth Road and Bouldnor Copse.

Problems with exposed roots on footpath S10 were reported together with a report of soil deposited in the Ningwood recycling area.

Cllr.Carr reported that cars were being sold from the grass area on opposite side to Shalfleet Garage and also the garage was neglecting to display its fuel prices.

Mention was made of a tri-parish event being planned to celebrate quality status.

The Chairman outlined problems being experienced by householders close to the Newbridge Social Club regarding unauthorised car parking.
